BACKGROUND:

This award submission recommends the purchase of a slope mower for Cecil Airport. The following drainage projects have removed pipe and placed sloped drainage ditches that have increase slope mower operations at the airport:

- F2010-01 Runway 18L/36R Runway Rehabilitation
- F2008-02 Taxiway Delta Extension
- F2012-01 Taxiway Echo and Echo One
- F2011-04 PH4 Airport Drainage Rehab PH4 (Landside and Airside)

The slope mower maintenance has been confirmed by JAA's Garage Foreman, who estimates the above-referenced on-going maintenance cost, which estimate is an average of service, tires, brake pads, blades and battery replacement for an initial five-year period, totaling \$10,000.00 (\$2,000.00 per year).

Procurement has reviewed this equipment purchase request against various vendors and cooperative purchasing sources and is of the opinion that, pursuant to § 3.08 of the Procurement Code, it is in JAA's best interest to purchase the requested slope mower by piggy-backing or utilizing the North Carolina Sheriff's Association Heavy Equipment Procurement Program Bid No. 19-03-0504, which was competitively awarded to ATMAX Equipment Co. (see Exhibit "A" for quote and specification summary).

RECOMMENDATION:

Cecil Airport recommends that JAA utilize North Carolina Sheriff Association Bid No. 19-03-0504 to make a properly noticed award to ATMAX Equipment Co. in a not-to-exceed amount of \$171,062.50, for the purchase of a slope mower for Cecil Airport. BACKGROUND:

The Jacksonville Aviation Authority (JAA) needs landscape maintenance equipment for the Jacksonville International Airport (JIA). The Facilities Department requests authorization to purchase a Challenger MT45E Agricultural Tractor to be used for airfield and landside grounds maintenance.

BACKGROUND:

On December 16, 2018, the Jacksonville Aviation Authority's (JAA) Awards Committee approved Award No. AC2018-12-05 for Generator Maintenance and Repair Services to Ring Power, utilizing St. Johns County's Countywide Generator Maintenance and Services Master Contract No. 13-MCC-RIN-04918. This award includes all of JAA's emergency generators at JIA, JAXEX and Cecil, as follows:

Due to administrative oversight, the original award did not include the monitoring system Omnimetrix, which is utilized at JIA to monitor 16 emergency generators for an additional annual cost of \$82,400.00 under the existing contract. Omnimetrix is offered exclusively through Ring Power Corporation and increases the systems reliability with proactive and predictive monitoring that monitor major failure point's service with alarm notifications to all concerned parties by cellular means. This monitoring service will prevent future failures which leads to cost savings and less down time.

RECOMMENDATION:

Facilities recommends JAA Award No. AC2018-12-05 to Ring Power Corporation, for routine maintenance and repair services, be amended to: (i) correct an administrative error of omitting the Omnimetrix System required to monitor JIA's 16 emergency generators; and (ii) increase the associated annual cost by \$82,400.00, for a total notto-exceed budgeted amount to \$762,000.00. Funds are budgeted within cost center 45133.77280.

BACKGROUND:

On July 27, 2015, the Jacksonville Aviation Authority (JAA) was approved via Award No. AC2015-07-07, to utilize the General Services Administration's (GSA) Contract No. GS-07-0377V with Daikin Applied Americas, Inc. to make a properly noticed award to American Air Filter International for the purchase of air conditioner filters (see attached Exhibit "A"). The award is in an annual not-to-exceed amount of \$30,000.00 and includes the purchase of one-inch, two-inch, four-inch and 12-inch filters used in the various heating, ventilation and air conditioning units found throughout the terminals and other buildings of the Jacksonville International Airport (JIA).

Due to an increase in product costs and frequency of filter changes, expenses incurred during fiscal year 2019 will exceed \$30,000.00. As such, Facilities requests authorization to increase the total amount by \$20,000.00. This increase will allow Facilities to remain in compliance with JAA's requirements for air filter changes.

RECOMMENDATION:

Facilities recommends JAA Award No. AC2015-07-07, awarded to American Air Filter International for air conditioning filters at JIA, be amended to increase the annual not-to-exceed amount total from \$30,000.00 to \$50,000.00, to address current fiscal year increases in product costs and filter change frequency. BACKGROUND:

The Jacksonville International Airport (JIA) has eight buses and two electric carts that currently operate at its three parking facilities, the Daily Surface, Economy I and Economy II. JIA's Parking function is responsible for the maintenance, repair and fuel costs incurred in operating these buses, in the 24-hours a day, seven days a week transport of passengers between the terminal and its parking facilities.

JIA is in the process of decommissioning and replacing two of its buses. After discussing this issue with Procurement, it was decided that, pursuant to § 3.08 of the Procurement Code, JAA's best interests are served by utilizing or piggybacking Houston-Galveston Area Council Contract No. BT01-17, which was competitively awarded to Creative Bus Sales, for the purchase of two ADA shuttle buses at a cost of \$129,287.30 (12-passenger with two wheelchair positions). JAA's Ground Transportation and Garage have reviewed and are in agreement with this request.

RECOMMENDATION:

Parking recommends that JAA utilize Houston-Galveston Area Council Contract No. BT01-17 to make a properly noticed award to Creative Bus Sales, Inc., pursuant to § 3.08 of the Procurement Code, for the purchase of two ADA shuttle buses (12-passenger with two wheelchair positions), in an amount not to exceed \$129,287.30, plus any reasonable processing fees associated with utilizing the referenced Contract.

BACKGROUND:

In November 2016, JAA issued Request for Proposals No. 17-06-24001 (RFP) and subsequently selected Intellisoft's Airport ICE software to manage and maintain badges and related credentials at JIA. As this application represents a critical system for JIA and helps ensure compliance with Federal regulations, it is in JAA's best interest to have continued software support from Intellisoft as the original equipment manufacturer (OEM).

As the OEM, Intellisoft is the only vendor that can provide software support and updates, so this request represents a sole-source purchase.

Annual maintenance is \$61,650 for the first year, which is consistent with pricing provided in response to the RFP.

RECOMMENDATION:

Information Technology recommends a properly noticed sole source award be made to Intellisoft, the OEM for software awarded pursuant to RFP No. 17-06-24001, for software support and maintenance, in an initial year not-to-exceed amount of \$61,650.00, with renewal options at approximately an annual three percent increase for up to four years at the sole discretion of JAA, for a potential total not-to-exceed amount of \$327,308.22.

BACKGROUND:

JAA previously issued Request for Proposals No. 18-01-24001 (RFP) and subsequently selected Rackspace to provide support and maintenance for Oracle eBusiness Suite and related environments and interfaces.

In anticipation of the necessity to upgrade JAA's Oracle applications, the RFP also prequalified the awardee to perform the upgrade from the current 12.1.3 version to the Oracle's latest release (12.2.8), if its upgrade proposal was acceptable to JAA in cost and in scope. Rackspace has delivered its pricing and statement of work, and JAA IT believes both are agreeable and wishes to move forward with the upgrade effort before our current applications fall out of Oracle's mainstream support.

BACKGROUND:

JAA currently uses SSI (Safety and Security Instruction) to deliver content for badge training and to record related exam results. This training is instrumental to JIA's badging process and compliance efforts.

Over time, the content of this training must be updated to remain current with regulations with which JAA must comply. In addition, the related technology for delivering the content must be updated occasionally so it is compatible with current technology and security protocols.

SSI training is interfaced directly to JIA's badging software, Airport ICE. Changing from SSI would be a significant effort and very costly, requiring not only selection of a different vendor, but the same effort to redevelop the content plus the additional effort to rewrite interfaces and certify them for Airport ICE. As such, JAA Information Technology recommends treating this as a sole source purchase.

The quote for refreshing the training is \$275,600.00. JAA Information Technology recommends adding a 5% contingency of \$13,780.00 for unanticipated and/or additional scope not considered in the quote but deemed appropriate once work begins. This would be a potential not-to-exceed award amount of \$289,380.00.

RECOMMENDATION:

Information Technology recommends JAA make a properly noticed sole-source award to SSi for updates to badge training and related services, in the amount of \$275,600.00, plus a 5% contingency of \$13,780.00 for unanticipated scope needs, for potential total not-to-exceed award amount of \$289,380.00.
